

Out-of-Field Teaching Assignments Survey 3 - FTE

Dear Connerton Elementary School Families,

Pasco County Schools is required to notify parents if their student is receiving instruction from a teacher who is teaching outside of their certified field. Individuals who are teaching out-of-field are qualified to teach but are required to take additional coursework or testing to add a teaching area and/or endorsement to their certificate. The state also requires a teacher to take coursework or in-service towards an English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) endorsement when the teacher is the primary language arts teacher and/or reading teacher for an ESOL student.

Early Dismissal & Transportation Changes



Arrival & Dismissal Procedures

This is a reminder that we do NOT have park and pick up during dismissal. Please do NOT park on the grass across the street or use the Primrose neighborhood. This creates a

safety issue not only for our students, but also for the neighborhood. Emergency vehicles cannot get in and out when cars are parked along the street. Thank you for helping keep our Crocs and our neighbors safe.

Charger families, please plan for pickup at the gates at 9:40 each morning. Due to teacher contact time in their contract, we had to adjust the time that teachers open their door for students each morning. Please plan for teachers to meet you at the gate at 9:40 to honor their contracts. Thank you.



Volunteer Information

The District made several changes to our volunteer requirements and application process for the 2024-2025 school year. Effective 7/1/2024, all volunteers will be required to complete a Level 2 background screening every 5 years. This background check will review records in the state of Florida as well as the national FBI database. The cost for this screening is \$41.25 and volunteers will be responsible for paying this cost. The District

will pay the yearly monitoring fee for each volunteer. To keep your prints current, you must complete the Raptor application yearly. If you do not reapply by the deadline provided, you will be responsible for the cost associated with a new background screening.

Before you can be approved to volunteer for the 2024-2025 school year, you will need to complete a Raptor volunteer application and this background screening.

You can access the 2024-2025 Volunteer Application on July 1st, 2024. This application will be posted on the Volunteer Programs page of our website at the following link: https://www.pasco.k12.fl.us/hreq/page/volunteer/.

The District partners with Fieldprint for fingerprinting appointments and processing. Fieldprint has locations throughout the county and many sites are open outside of regular work hours, including weekends. The code listed below is now active. We would encourage you to be printed as soon as possible to avoid any delays once the application opens. Please use the following directions to schedule a fingerprinting appointment:

- 1. Go to the following link: FIELDPRINT SCHEDULING.
- 2. Select "sign up" if you have never utilized Fieldprint before.
- 3. Select "I know my code" from the dropdown menu when prompted to do so.
- 4. Enter the following code, "FPPASCOVECHSVol".
- 5. After selecting your appointment, you will be prompted to make the payment.

The following is a list of offenses that disqualify individuals from approval. <u>Disqualifying</u> Offenses.

Any other felony offenses, crimes against children, and/or violence will be reviewed in accordance with the District's Professional Review Committee. This committee is responsible for reviewing background screenings for employees, vendors and volunteers.

Please note the average processing time for reviewing and approving background screenings is 30 days. We encourage you to complete your volunteer application and background screening early so that you can be approved to volunteer for upcoming events and opportunities for the 2024-2025 school year.

We know this additional background screening places a financial responsibility on our volunteers, but the District believes this step is necessary to ensure we have up to date background information pertaining to all adults that interact with students and staff on our campuses. Our students' safety is always our first priority.

To be promoted to fourth grade, a student must score a Level 2 or higher in reading on the statewide standardized English Language Arts assessment. The English Language Arts assessment will be administered in May.

> Encourage your child to read at least 30 minutes a day and to finish a chapter book per week.

To access digital text for your child to read at home:

As a courtesy, Pasco County Schools provides all students with access to digital resources through myPascoConnect. Please assist your child in selecting appropriate books, articles, videos to build knowledge around topics of interest.

Help your child select texts they want to read.

- Talk to your child about their interests (i.e. space, sports, dance, music, animals, video games, robotics, and etc.)
- Make connections to topics they are learning in science, social studies, reading so they can continue to build content knowledge.

Encourage your child to read different types of literature and informational text.

Here are some sample questions you can ask your child when they are reading.

Literature/Fiction

Fables, fairy tales, folk tales, legends, myths, poetry, verse, mystery, science fiction, historical fiction, etc.

- What lesson did you learn from the story?
- What challenges does the main character face and how do they overcome those challenges?
- How do the illustrations contribute to your understanding of the text?
- What are some of the key events in the story?

Informational/ Non-fiction

Magazines, newspapers, non-fiction books, research, speeches, infographic, blography, etc.

- What are you learning from the text?
- What have you learned from the text features in the text?
- · What are the most important points and details presented in each text?
- · What are you still wondering that you want to learn more about?


